Pastor's Corner.....

Dear Parishioners,



Before embarking on a planning process, it may be helpful to consider some aspects of developing a pastoral plan. Effective pastoral planning does not just happen, it is rooted in eight foundational dimensions of ministry, which need to be nur-

tured and developed over time. Understanding these eight dimensions, will help our parish assess the current situation and then develop an action based plan to build upon previous successes and new pastoral opportunities.

Many bishops, pastors, religious, and lay leaders know that effective ministry takes time, energy, knowledge, skills and careful planning and implementation. Successful pastoral ministry is not just about planning programs and activities, even more important, it is about focusing on the desired outcome, identifying the opportunities and challenges to achieve this outcome, working toward the goal by setting aside the proper human and financial resources to implement the plan and finally assessing and refining the plan.

The starting point therefore for creating successful parish ministry begins with intentionally identifying a vision based on the outcome desired. This beginning with the end in mind starts with a scan of the current situation. In other words, it begins with an assessment of the current reality including the trends, issues, opportunities and challenges facing a parish. The scan or assessment answers the question, where are we now? Additionally, the scan if done with honesty asks: *what is working and what is not working*? This assessment leads to the question *where do we want to be*? In light of the assessment you just completed, most likely several areas to strengthen were identified. As you move to the next step of the planning process, keep in mind the need to prioritize.

Once a parish identifies "where we want to be," it can create some strategic goals and objectives that act as a roadmap. Results-based planning is long-range and iterative, not episodic. It includes continual review and refinement of pastoral strategies over time to make sure that the activities and projects do support the long term goals and outcomes and do respond to the lived reality of the faith community. In a sense, this approach implies thinking through and doing things in an orderly and disciplined way, basing what we choose to do on facts rather than assumptions, while at the same time retaining a degree of flexibility.

In the end, it is always important to remember that a plan is a guide. In the assessment step, it is possible that the parish identifies several of the foundational dimensions and guiding principles that need to be addressed. However, in the planning process, it is important to remember that only eight desired goals or core directions that the Archdiocese identified.
