Pastor's Corner....

Dear Parishioners,

I hope and pray that you have a chance to read the two previous bulletins giving you an introduction about the Parish Pastoral planning that we are going to embark in our parish.....every week, I will try to reflect and share with you the



important information so that you may be aware of what is going on....This weekend, came to my mind the reading from last Tuesday from St. Paul to the Romans:

"As a body is one though it has many parts, and all the parts of the body, though many, are one body, so also Christ." Many parts, one body through Christ. (Roman 12:4-5)

Seeing our parish at this present moment with different cultures, I cannot help but be amazed at how we are similar from almost 2000 years ago. We are coming together from many different backgrounds to form one body through Christ and His Holy Spirit.

And this is one of the things that I reflected on the most as I read the readings today, one of the things I never really paid attention to before. At the time, Judaism as a whole was fragmented. It's even stated in the reading from Acts how the Jews staying in Jerusalem at the time were from many different regions and backgrounds. But after the resurrection and most definitely the arrival of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost, it was the start of something new. As it says in the Psalm, *God sent down His Spirit, and renewed the face of the earth.*

This was the start of something new. There was a renewal. The new covenant was sealed and it was a game changer. In the Gospel, Jesus breathes on the disciples and effectively breathes new life into them, and into us. We are filled with His Spirit.

No longer are we Parthians, Medes, Egyptians, Elamites. No longer are we English, Italian, Hispanic, Nigerian, Kenyan, Jamaican, Trinidarian, Chinese. No longer are we from the Philippines, or from the United States, or from India, or other part of the world. Starting at Pentecost and up through today, we are simply Christian.

We are One, Holy, Catholic, and Apostolic Church. We were truly many parts, One Body in Christ. And this is *the one thing* that I wish all of our parishioners could experience and see and feel – the joy and love and *power* of the Holy Spirit when people come together in Christ.

To witness the Holy Spirit at work in both these seemingly different, but at the same time strikingly similar realms is truly amazing and inspiring. It is and only can be, the work of the Holy Spirit, though which we truly are many parts, One Body!

As we continue on our reflection on the Pastoral Planning and looking at our present parish community, we can ask these questions: Where have we been? Where are we going in the next 5-10 years from now? Where have we gone off course?

I invite you, therefore, to reflect the eight core directions of the Pastoral Plan that The Archdiocese has identified.

- 1. Celebration of the Sunday Eucharist with full, conscious and active participation by the faithful
- 2. Opportunities for prayer, spiritual formation and enrichment
- 3. A communal life in the parish which offers welcome, hospitality & outreach
- 4. Strong pastoral leadership in the parish which promotes diverse & collaborative roles of pastoral service
- 5. Effective pastoral governance structures & committees in the parish which promote stewardship and ensure accountability
- 6. Supporting the family, the domestic church
- 7. Commitment to a renewed evangelization catechesis & formation in the faith
- 8. A strong Witness to an Apostolic Mission– Outreach Ministries and Service.
