As we know, the provincial government made a revision to the "Roadmap for Reopening" as it relates to

places of worship allowing us to open at 15% capacity in *Step One* and 25% in *Step Two*.

Step One began on Friday, June 11 and Step Two began on Wednesday, June **30** and the Archdiocese gave us permission to open churches observing the new capacity strictions. However, we were instructed to begin celebrating pubic masses as soon as we are certain that we can implement our Worship Safe health and safety protocols. A group of parishioners met with our new pastor to explore our readiness and we were able to start immediately thanks to the willingness of committed and generous volunteers. IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR ALL VOLUNTEERS



Strengthening Our Caring Community was mandated by the Cardinal over 20 years ago as part of the larger Archdiocesan Safe Environment policy, implemented for the safety and care of our community and all who participate and engage in our parishes and programs. All volunteers are required to comply with this program which is implemented and managed by the Archdiocese Volunteer Screening Department and administered through Parish's Volunteer Screening Coordinator and Screening Commit-

Ministry positions are assigned a "High" or "General" risk level based on responsibility, government laws and regulations, participant vulnerability, and volunteer exposure to which the volunteer screening process directly supports. Outlined below is an overview of the mandatory screening steps that all applicants must successfully complete and commit to, before they can be accepted into (or continue in) ministry and become an active Archdiocese/Parish volunteer.

MANDATORY SCREENING STEPS GENERAL RISK:

- Application Form
- Ministry Position Review
- Orientation & Training (includes Code of Conduct, AODA, OHRC, Parish, and Ministry training)
- Volunteer Acknowledgement and Agreement Form
- Ongoing Supervision and Evaluation

HIGH RISK

(POSITIONS OF TRUST):

- Application Form
- ◆ Interview
- Reference Check
- Criminal Records & Judicial Matters Check (adults 18+ complete through our third-party service provider)
- Orientation & Training (includes Code of Conduct, AODA, OHRC, Parish, and Ministry training)
- Volunteer Acknowledgement and Agreement Form
- Ongoing Supervision and Evaluation

Volunteers usually **commit for one year**, during which time there is a probationary period to review mutual "best fit", along with **ongoing training** to support them in their role, **performance evaluations**, and feedback to review and ensure "best fit" continually. ATTENTION HIGH RISK VOLUNTEERS

We are going to begin a process of returning to prepare our parish to return to a less restricted time. If any of the above steps have been missing or have not taken place (i.e. signed job description, evidence of ongoing training and evaluation, etc.) during the time you have served in a high risk position, you will be asked to undergo an evaluation in order to assess asked to be room to pastors to adapt them according to pastoral circumstances. Our records show that this is an items that is missing in most files. Anyone expecting to return to any volunteers position will be interviewed and we will take this opportunity to renew a commitment that is in keeping with the norms established by the Volunteer Screening Program.

(AOD) ANNUAL OFFENCE DECLARATION which involves signing a form declaring that no criminal offences have taken place in the in the past year. This form, once signed, is submitted to be added to all volunteer's files in a sealed envelope.

(AODA) Accessibility for Ontarians with Disabilities Act.

The Accessibility for Ontarians with Disabilities Act (AODA) is an Ontario law enacted in 2005, mandating that organizations follow standards to become more accessible to people with disabilities. The goal for the

province is to be fully accessible by 2025 by removing barriers in a number of areas. All levels of government, private sectors, and non-profits must comply with this legislation.

Since 2012, the Archdiocese of Toronto has been implementing the required standards of the AODA as they become law and are committed to providing a welcoming, accessible and inclusive environment for all of its parishioners, visitors, volunteers and employees. The AODA aligns with the Archdiocese's desire to be of service, equitable and socially responsible. On our parish website at Accessibility you will find the Archdiocese of Toronto's AODA Accessible Customer Service Policy.

We are asking our volunteers to please take the time to read over the policy and complete the training in a timely manner.

The OADA Training Manual can be found on the Archdiocese of Toronto Volunteer Screening Program - Orientation & Trainwebsite. Then select the ing AODA Online Training Modules. TEACHER PASTORAL REFERENCE

Please plan to have a conversation with your pastor early in the process (not the week before you are submitting your application) and you will avoid disappointment and stress at the time when applications are to be submitted. The following are required by all those requesting a pastoral reference:

- ♦ You are a registered member of the parish using offertory envelopes for at least a year prior to the request.
- ♦ You participate at Sunday/ Saturday mass in our parish for a minimum of one year prior to the request.
- ♦ You are involved in some way at our parish.
- ♦ Make your request 3 months prior to the submission of your application.
- ♦ You are the one making the request personally. No request will be accepted by a relative or a parent or any third party.
- ♦ The pastor has to be able to recommend you and that can only happen if he knows you at the basic level of regular mass attendance. Personal knowledge of the candidate's faith practice is what the pastor needs to recommend.

FIRST FEAST DAY OF BLESSED MICHAEL MCGIVNEY.

Formed by Father Michael McGivney with the men of his parish, the Knights of Columbus was committed to the principles of charity and unity, while supporting the faith and financial viability of its members and their families. It soon grew into an organization whose members supported one another while also contributing to their parishes, their communities, their countries, and the world. Father McGivney was born on Aug 12, 1852. When Father McGivney died on Aug. 14, 1890, at age 38, his survivors included 6,000 members of the Order that started in the basement of St. Mary's Church. Today, the Knights of Columbus is a world wide organization with more than 2 million Catholic men. His Feast will be celebrated on Aug 13,2021

Dear friends of the Archdiocese of Toronto,

Over the past several weeks, there has been a painful national conversation on the tragic history of residential schools in Canada. The role of the Catholic Church in the residential school

system has been a central part of that discussion.

We acknowledge the terrible suffering that took place and condemn the system, established by the federal government and operated by faith communities, which separated children, often forcibly, from their parents and attempted to strip away their language, culture and identity. The Catholic Church must continue to atone for our involvement in this dark history. It is undeniable that some Catholic teachers (priests, religious men and women and lay staff) entrusted to care for children at residential schools assaulted the dignity of the students through mistreatment, neglect and abuse.

A recent poll suggested that only 10% of Canadians have a thorough understanding of the history of residential schools. We also know that many Catholics have asked for additional information, unsure of this history and wondering how to respond when asked about it. In addition to resources like the Truth and Reconciliation Commission Report, we have prepared a webpage at: www.archtoronto.org/residential schools with numerous resources, links and information.

We encourage you to access our latest document, "Background for Catholics – Residential Schools", which provides answers to eight frequently asked questions on recent topics of discussion.

We'd also like to make you aware of the following recent developments: On June 29, 2021, it was announced that a delegation of Indigenous Elders/Knowledge Keepers, residential school survivors and youth from across the country will meet with Pope Francis from December 17-20 at the Vatican. There will be four days of meetings – focused on encounters with First Nations, Métis and Inuit participants – as well as a final audience with all delegates coming together on December 20, 2021. Pope Francis is deeply committed to hearing directly from Indigenous Peoples, expressing his heartfelt closeness, addressing the impact of colonization and the role of the Church in the residential school system, in the hopes of responding to the suffering of Indigenous Peoples and the ongoing effects of intergenerational trauma.

We have received numerous inquiries regarding financial support related to residential schools. A more detailed response on the settlement process, what has been paid and where we have fallen short, can be found in the latest "Background for Catholics – Residential Schools" document. Currently, dioceses across the country, including the Archdiocese of Toronto, are in discussions to determine how to best engage in a renewed financial effort to meet the goal of the \$25 million "best efforts" campaign. In addition, the archdiocese is developing a series of pastoral initiatives, with Indigenous participation, to engage parishioners and the broader community in a continued journey of prayer, listening and dialogue as part of ongoing reconciliation efforts.

We look forward to sharing more information with you on these plans in the days ahead.

CCCB STATEMENT - DELEGATION TO THE HOLY SEE

Following the 10 June 2021 announcement regarding the delegation of Indigenous people to meet with the Holy Father to foster meaningful encounters of dialogue and healing, the Catholic Bishops of Canada are pleased to announce that the delegation is scheduled to take place from 17-20 December 2021 in compliance with global travel restrictions.

Pope Francis is deeply committed to hearing directly from Indigenous Peoples, expressing his heartfelt closeness, addressing the impact of colonization and the role of the Church in the residential school system, in the hopes of responding to the suffering of Indigenous Peoples and the ongoing effects of intergenerational trauma. The Bishops of Canada are deeply appreciative of the Holy Father's spirit of openness in generously extending an invitation for personal encounters with each of the three distinct groups of delegates – First Nations, Métis and Inuit – as well as a final audience with all delegates together on 20 December 2021.

This pastoral visit will include the participation of a diverse group of Elders/ Knowledge Keepers, residential school survivors and youth from across the country, accompanied by a small group of Bishops and Indigenous leaders. Planning for the delegation is ongoing and further details will be announced when they are available.

The Bishops of Canada reaffirm their sincere hope that these forthcoming encounters will lead to a shared future of peace and harmony between Indigenous Peoples and the Catholic Church in Canada.
