SANCTUARY LAMP APRIL 4-9

For the Health of **Pat Weston**

For the repose of the soul of **José Álvarez Chávez**

Call the parish office to request prayer intentions.

As you know, the sanctuary lamp burns near the tabernacle to remind us of Jesus' Presence among us in the Blessed Sacrament of the Altar. Here at Prince of Peace, each week parishioners may request special prayer intentions to be added to the light of the candle and brought to our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament.

There is a line in this passage the woman caught in adultier that is easily overlooked: "...beginning with the elders." This reveals an interesting dynamic within human communities. Generally speaking, those who are younger tend to lack the wisdom and

experience that comes with age. Though the young may find it hard to admit, those who have lived a long life have a unique and broad picture of life. This enables them to be far more prudent in their decisions and judgments, especially when it comes to the more intense situations in life.

SL ShareLife

Today's Gospel shares the parable of the woman accused of adultery. Jesus admonishes the gathered scribes and Pharisees. They want her stoned and Jesus says, "Let anyone among you who is without sin be the first to throw a stone at her." Our Lord's message is one of great love, forgiveness and respect for all of God's people. Social Service agencies funded by ShareLife have an 'open intake policy' and provide help based on need, not on lifestyle, gender, ethnicity, nor the faith beliefs of those they help. Our goal this year is \$83,000.00 which our parish takes on with courage and determination. Last weekend, our first ShareLife Sunday collection was **\$12,304.80, (18%)** of our parish goal. Thankyou for your generosity.

RECONCILIATION TREE



In the sanctuary of the church during the season of lent, we have placed a barren tree. Each week of lent, you

are invited to focus on an area in your life in which you are in need of reconciliation. When you forgive or are forgiven, or when you recognize a place in which forgiveness is needed even if you are unable to reconcile at this time, you are invited to tie a white ribbon on the tree. Last week we focused on reconciliation with God. This week, we focus on reconciliation with our own hearts.




