# MINISTRY IN THE GARDEN SESSION 3 THE ROOTS OF THE CRISIS

Theme: The Human Roots of the Ecological Crisis (LS 101–136)
Summary: This section delves



into the mindset behind the destruction. Pope Francis warns of the "technocratic paradigm"—a way of thinking that elevates efficiency, control, and domination above wisdom, ethics, and community. Our consumer culture worships novelty and productivity and sees nature only in terms of usefulness. The crisis is not just technological; it is spiritual. We have forgotten limits. We have traded wonder for manipulation. Join us this Sunday, July 27 at 6pm in the parish hall and in the garden to pray the Liturgy of the Hours, to reflect with fellow parishioners and connect with creation.



#### Mass Intention Guidelines

What can an intention be offered for? The repose of a deceased soul, health, thanksgiving, or for personal intentions (all said as "for the intentions of")

What does an intention include? Announced intentions are said during the mass on the designated day, published in the bulletin and on the announcement slides. Sanctuary lamps are not said but are published weekly. They run from Monday to Saturday of the designated week. Unannounced intentions are announced but for an unknown day and at an unknown parish.

What do I have to do to book an intention? In-person at the parish office, provide staff with the first and last name of the person and the day(s) the intention is for. Intentions go fast, so you may want to book a month or two ahead of the desired date. Intentions over the phone and by email will be taken at the discretion of the office. Please pay your stipend when you come to book it, or at least one week before the designated day or week.

Are there limits on intentions? There are no hard limits on the amount of intentions that you can book, but because of the high demand we ask that parishioners be respectful of each others' wishes for intentions. As such, we request that parishioners only book up to one mass intention and sanctuary lamp per month and to please refrain from booking a mass intention if others have already placed intentions for them.

How many people can be included in an intention? One person or two people with the same last name. If there is a group of people, you may book it for the [Last Name] Family or for your own personal intentions.

#### REGISTERING IN YOUR PARISH

Registering in your parish is an important first step to becoming an active member in the local church community. Registration brings with it tangible benefits that can help a person become more fully engaged in the local church. Please note that parish and diocesan leadership will not share the registration information with anyone, and it is completely confidential.
